SURF COACH SAFETY AND RESCUE COMPETENCY AWARD

Award Aims:

This award is applicable to those undertaking surf coaching and instruction activity and for surfboard hiring organisations. It aims to establish a minimum vocational standard that demonstrates a level of competence for the safety of participants under instruction during a coached surf activity session undertaken in primarily wading depth water and to establish the necessary skills and knowledge to provide basic rescue response and life support. Holders of this award should take careful account of local conditions where they are coaching and the scope of the activity and the guidance provided by local risk assessments and a location specific LOP. Surf Coaches employed at locations using artificial wave technology (AWT) will need to undertake the additional AWT module

- Casualty rescue and care techniques operating in an aquatic environment
- Understanding the beach/fluvial location where you will work as a coach and the impact of water flow, tides, rips, weather conditions and other beach and water users.

Award Learning outcomes: As a Surf /water activities Coach to ISA L1 (or equivalent)

- 1. Demonstrate knowledge and skills required to set up and run surf/water based activities in moving water environments
- 2. Demonstrate an understanding and knowledge of your role as a Coach/Lifesaver in a public accessible space or water/beach environment
- 3. Demonstrate knowledge of the surf/water environment and its impacts clients and teaching team involved in the session
- 4. Demonstrate knowledge and skill to provide preventative and reactionary safety throughout the in-water session
- 5. Demonstrate an understanding of the basic skills and knowledge to administer basic life support.
- 6. Demonstrate an understanding of the skills, knowledge and competence required to undertake first aid in an aquatic environment.
- 7. Demonstrate that you can achieve the required swim ability and aquatic rescue standards.
- 8. Demonstrate a level of competence in carrying out an appropriate rescue according to the circumstances using: no equipment, a rescue tube, surf board or other flotation device used in the teaching process for the particular activity
- 9. Demonstrate knowledge of the skills required to perform a safe and effective water rescue during surf/water activity lessons without compromising the safety of others in your care
- 10. Demonstrate the skills, knowledge and competence required to support and manage a suspected spinal casualty in an aquatic environment.
- 11. Demonstrate the correct patient aftercare to promote recovery and prevent deterioration including handover to the emergency services and post event reporting requirements.
- 12. Demonstrate an understanding of the safe working practices of a Surf Centre/School and the importance of PPE in daily work and in a rescue or an emergency
- 13. Demonstrate an understanding of RNLI /Beach patrols, Lifeguards and inshore rescue resources and how the Coast Guard operates
- 14. Demonstrate how to understand the beach/fluvial location conditions that will impact your coaching

Assessment Process:

This course can be Trainer Assessed

Learners will be assessed using the SLSGB recognised TA checklist criteria by a variety of assessment methods. These are inclusive of, but not limited to:

- Observation
- Online Tests (Myagi results must be evidenced by the TA)
- Oral Questioning
- Practical demonstration

Typical format of delivery:

- a) 8 hours of online learning should be completed prior to attendance of the course through the SLSGB Online Learning Environment 'Myagi'
- b) 24 Guided Learning Hours delivered over a number of set weeks or over 3 days.

(Please note that 24 GLH is only the minimum hours that must be delivered. If candidates require further training then additional hours should be added on at the discretion of the Trainer assessing the candidate.
