This award will enable participants to provide lifesaving skills when providing safety cover as part of a water safety team or when working in close proximity to participants.	
Award Learning outcomes:

Demonstrate by achievement of 100% pass of the Myagi module Mastering the Skill of Seeing Accurately 2. Demonstrate the knowledge and skills needed to Patrol a Beach as a Lifeguard 3. Demonstrate an understanding of the working practices that are in place when working as a Beach as a Lifeguard 4. Demonstrate an understanding of the different communication methods available to Lifeguards 5. Demonstrate a level of competence in paddling a rescue board that would give them the capability to act as supporting water safety cover for Surf Life Saving sessions 6. Demonstrate a level of competence in carrying out a rescue using a rescue tube that would give them the capability to act as supporting water cover for Surf Life Saving sessions 7. Demonstrate an understanding of the basic skills and knowledge to administer basic life support. 8. Demonstrate an understanding of the skills, knowledge and competence required to undertake first aid in an aquatic environment.

Guidance:	<ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ Training to be a Surf Life Saver involves physical exertion in both indoor pool and outdoor environments. The open water environment also involves variable temperatures of cold water. If a candidate has any medical condition which might impair them they would be advised to contact their GP before undertaking the training course.➤ Candidates should be able to dive, without risk to their hearing, to a maximum depth of 2m. It may be appropriate for candidates to seek medical advice with regard to diving to depths greater than 1.5m.
