Competent in the operation of an LOP and EAP A statement from a Club Referee, who must be a qualified Lifeguard or a TA for the Lifeguard Award, to confirm that the candidate is suitable for the roll</p> <p>Applications will also be considered from TA's who train or have trained the above awards and those who have been Lifeguards or Surf Lifesavers but who did not renew their award in recent years or are unable to meet the swim times. In these cases, a self-declaration must be completed together with a Referees statement as above</p>

<p>To provide a safe, authorised, volunteer advisory safety service to the public using our beaches that are not patrolled appropriate for the C 19 Government stages of release of lock down for beaches</p> <p>It is an at a "safe distance" activity following C 19 guidance for solo Wardens and/or for the Warden to lead and manage a team of Assistants with appropriate approved lifesaving awards, to observe the beach, beach surrounds and close inshore ocean area to provide relevant safety advice to beach users and to be able to call in outside rescue/CPR help when needed. (Assistants must be 16 or over and if under 18 have parental consent)</p> <p>Award holders will be able to:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Apply the SLSGB C 19 operational guidance and take appropriate safe steps for personal, team member and others wellbeing • Fully understand the latest C 19 Government guidance • Manage a Team • Communicate safety advice in line with the local operating conditions • Communicate with emergency services for incidents requiring outside assistance
